President Nemo opened the meeting with a reference to next week's speaker. Major Okill Stuart will be speaking to us about his experiences when he took part in the Juno Beach landings on June 6, 1944 in Normandy, France. Also, he will be talking about his present campaign to keep Ste. Anne de Bellevue Military Hospital open for veterans needing care.

Herman Alves recited the 4-Way Test of the things we think, say or do – le critère des quatre questions.

Do you know who spoke to our club on August 13, 1929? None other than Winston Churchill. It was on the second of his Next meeting: seven visits to Canada.

Our guest speaker, Nathalie BOUTIN was introduced by Henry Zalzal and thanked by Steve Sadler. She is the founder



of Fondation Ekuus, the purpose of which is to help young sexual abuse victims. It is a non-profit charity that started in May 2008 and seeks to open centres across Quebec. Details can be viewed at www.ekuus.net Ms BOUTIN said that 1/4 of the girls 18 and under in Quebec were victims of sexual

aggression. For boys the fraction dropped to 1 in 6. She urged recognition of this reality and spoke from personal experience.

Our second guest speaker of the morning took us to Jaipur in the NW of India and a home that is turning out a remarkable quality of young woman. Rick Sala was introduced by Henry Zalzal. He is President of the Board of Can Serve Foundation, a registered, Canadian charity. Details at www.canserve.ca The charity exists to serve the needs of the home in Jaipur



where the dream of abandoned girls gets transformed so they become productive members of society. He spoke of the founder, a graduate of Concordia in Special Education. She and her husband have put \$250,000 of their own money into this work, providing capital and leadership, dedicated to empowering abandoned

girls.
