Guest Speaker: Carlo Pugliese introduced J-P Picard who serves in his second year as president of NOVA Montreal, and NOVA Montreal Foundation. Before retirement, M. Picard was Corporate director, Sales & Marketing for Mittal Steel, the world's largest steel company. He currently presides the Westmount Municipal Association and is board member of the Royal Montreal Curling Club. He is a member of the Forest & Stream Club and the Beaconsfield Golf Club. Jean-Pierre was born in Quebec City and is a graduate of Laval University. He has undertaken a second career as an Executive Coach with Optimum Talent in Montreal.

In his remarks, M. Picard spoke of the history of VON, going back to the late 1890's in Montreal. "We became an independent, locally based organization with a new name in 2006. Our new name is the *only* thing that has changed. We are still the same organization that has been helping people in Montréal since 1898. The people, services and commitment to

the community that you have come to trust over the years remain the same. We continue to provide:

- Respite and assistance with activities of daily living to caregivers of people who suffer from Alzheimers Disease, Multiple Sclerosis, strokes, cancer and frail health;
