Www.barkafountion.org They spoke about their work in Burkina Faso (BF), a land-locked nation of 16 million people, with six borders, lying immediately to the south of Mali. Water is about peace. The UN has just declared clean water as a natural birthright of all people. Barka Foundation has



developed a micro model for sustainable, clean water development in a village in BF. Several Rotary Clubs in the US are applying for a Rotary Future Visions Grant with which to enable Barka to expand the model. Barka now seeks to become registered in Canada and find support from Canadian Rotary Clubs. Steve Sadler expressed thanks to our two

speakers.
